Our Vision & Aims at St. Patrick's Primary School



As a Catholic School, we at St Patrick's, Legamaddy, seek to provide a caring, secure and happy environment in which all children are treated as unique individuals who are given the opportunity to grow in independence and develop self-confidence.

We believe this will enable our children to be better prepared personally, academically, spiritually and socially for the challenges of young adult life.

General Information

St Patrick's Primary School is a newly extended and renovated co-education Primary School for the Parish of Bright. The new extension was completed in 2014. Our school is specially designed to have two separate spaces for Key Stage 1 (P1-P3) which incorporates a play based learning activity area for these pupils and is connected by a corridor to the Key Stage 2 (P4-P7) new classrooms and ICT area. We are located in an idyllic rural setting outside of the rural village of Ballynoe and three miles from the town of Downpatrick.

Our modern, bright, well-resourced school consists of the following

- 7 classrooms all with computerised interactive white boards.
- P1-P3 play based activity area.
- 26 IPADs tablets which are utilised by all students to develop the child's ability to become effective learners and provide them with the life skills for modern society.
- A fully resourced ICT interactive area with 12 workstations to extend and enrich the learning opportunities of all students in each class.
- A multi-purpose assembly hall.
- Additional support room.
- Staff room and office accommodation
- The outside facility has two areas 1) a designated Foundation Stage, Key Stage 1 (P1-P3) area and 2) Key Stage 2 (P4-P7) play area. The children in Primary One to Seven also have access to a purpose built Modular Play System on a polymeric safety surface. This includes a story telling area, raised sand beds, outdoor musical instruments, extensive sports equipment and games, a trim trail and a water wall. The school also has an extensive outdoor agility course. All these enhance and extend the children's learning and enrich their experiences.
- Our current **staffing** is made up of an Acting Principal plus 6 teachers. The school secretary, building caretaker, classroom assistants, supervisory assistants and school meals staff complete a team dedicated to the education and welfare of children entrusted to their care.







St Patrick's School Inspection 2012: A Very Good School

St Patrick's Primary School Legamaddy was inspected in April 2012.

Overall Finding of the Inspection

In the areas inspected, the quality of education provided by this school is **Very Good**. The school is meeting very effectively the educational and pastoral needs of the children; and has demonstrated its capacity for sustained self-improvement.

The strengths of the school include:

- the highly motivated and confident children, who are involved in planning and evaluating their own learning;
- the quality of the teaching;
- the very good quality of the pastoral care provision, which supports the holistic development of all of the children;
- the very good standards attained by the children in literacy and numeracy;
- the highly effective leadership and management;
- the very good co-ordination of literacy, numeracy and SEN provision, leading to the improvement in the children's achievements and standards.

The Primary One Curriculum

Our Foundation Stage teachers are fully committed to the Northern Ireland curriculum and embrace the importance of the Early Years. Our P1 teacher and Classroom Assistant work hard to ensure the children experience a smooth transition from preschool settings.

Learning is fun! Children benefit from challenging play based learning that encourages important social, emotional and physical skills as well as promoting their early literacy and numeracy development. The children in P1 and P2 learn to think, problem solve, share, co-operate and develop self-esteem and confidence: essential tools they need in their toolkits.

The Primary Curriculum is set out in Six Areas of Learning:

- Language and Literacy
- Mathematics and Numeracy
- The Arts
- The World Around Us
- · Personal Development and Mutual Understanding
- · Physical Development and Movement



At the heart of the curriculum lies an explicit emphasis on the development of skills and capabilities for lifelong learning and operating effectively in society. Through opportunities to engage in active learning contexts across all areas of the curriculum children will progressively develop:

Positive Behaviour

All young people have a right to be valued and respected and to have their abilities and talents nurtured and developed to their full potential. We believe that positive behaviour and assertive discipline are essential for effective teaching and learning to take place. We value the need for clear expectations, clear rules and clear procedures. These are essential to cultivate in pupils an awareness that they are responsible for the consequences of their own actions.

All staff at St.Patrick's are trained in Assertive Discipline in line with our positive behaviour policy. Respect for people and property is encouraged, self-discipline is promoted and positive modelling of behaviour is celebrated. We value the essential need for a mutually supportive partnership between teachers and parents in order to develop the young person and grow and develop as an individual.


Our emphasis is always on giving encouragement and praise rather than criticism or punishments. We value the importance of rewards as a means of recognising good behaviour, good efforts, achievements and successes. We apply a system of rewards that is intended to be fair and effective for all our pupils. They are aimed at promoting and reinforcing acceptable behaviour and promoting self-esteem.

Classroom - every class in our school operates a 'Classroom Management Plan'. This consists of rules, rewards and consequences and helps reinforce positive behaviour within our school. Classroom rules are made by each class at the start of the academic year and displayed in all classrooms alongside rewards and consequences. Good behaviour plans encourage pupils to take ownership of their own actions. Good choices and good behaviour will be rewarded and unacceptable behaviour will be dealt with in line with the agreed and appropriate consequences.



Super Student of the Week - at assembly each week, a Super Student Award is presented to two children per class. The Super Student is awarded for outstanding work or behaviour.

House System - The school operates a "House System" to promote positive behaviour and to encourage care for others and the environment. All children are grouped into four "Houses" - Red, Yellow, Blue, and Green and each child is given a badge of the appropriate colour. House points are awarded for good school work, helping others, tidiness and many acts of good behaviour. At assembly each week the total points for each 'House' are read out and children are encouraged to get as many points as possible for their team. A cup is awarded to the winning 'House' each term.



Assessment and Reporting Procedures

At St. Patrick's PS Legamaddy, children are encouraged to take risks with their learning which fosters self-esteem and develops their self-confidence. Learning is essentially open ended and encourages active use of learning strategies. Children are taught to identify, use and evaluate thinking skills and personal capabilities through the range of learning areas.

Children are encouraged to self-reflect through a variety of assessment for learning strategies. Assessment is an integral part of learning in St Patrick's PS, Legamaddy. Children are assessed regularly in order for teachers to build a comprehensive picture of each pupil, their progress and future learning needs. Parents are kept informed of their child's progress throughout the year with parent / teacher meetings in October/ February and detailed end of year reports.

Assessment in the Foundation Stage

Assessment in Primary 1 and Primary 2 is mainly observation based. Adult observations are carried out with the children in an unobtrusive way and inform future planning. Children are made aware of their progress by receiving positive feedback and work together with their teacher to suggest ways to improve. Teachers assess pupils' cross curricular skills, thinking skills and personal capabilities, levels of concentration and involvement and emotional development.

Assessment from Primary 3 – Primary 7

Assessment in St Patrick's happens on a daily basis. Teachers plan meticulously to meet the needs of all children and evaluate their learning each week, setting new targets for further development. More formal assessments take place during the year using the NFER Progress in Maths, Progress in English, MIST, and NRIT. Test results are digitally analysed at individual, class and whole school level to inform future planning.



Special Educational Needs

The early identification of children with Special Educational Needs is our priority. Our Special Educational Needs Co-ordinator liaises with class teachers in identifying specific needs in order to meet the needs of these pupils. Parents are kept informed of their child's progress during regular consultations. The school also works closely with outside agencies (medical, social, educational and psychological) in order to meet the needs of all our pupils.

Out of School Hours Day Care Provision

Breakfast Club (P1- P7) 8.15am to 8.55am

St. Patrick's Primary School provides a daily breakfast club to facilitate working parents from 8.15am every morning throughout the year. For a small fee, children can enjoy cereal, fruit, toast and fruit juice. The club ensure the pupils have a very welcoming and cheerful start to the school day.

Buddies After school Club (P1-P7) 2.00pm - 4.45pm (Monday-Thursday) 2.00pm - 4.00pm (Friday)



St. Patrick's provides Buddies Club after school wrap around child care to help working parents. It is available to all pupils (P1-P7). Pupils receive a drink and snack. They take part in activities and start homework. £10 one-off registration fee and £3 per hour. Contact the school office for information.


